Truckoman intend to continue to invest in the Omani economy. Recently we have constructed a logistics and head office facility at Jifnein and are now investing in our operational infrastructure in new bases at Duqm, Safa and Adam Since Truckoman is 100% Omani owned all our own profits are retained in country. Funds generated from Truckoman activities are largely invested to support our own business, in addition to supporting the Group's other business ventures in Oman. We also pay a significant level of corporate tax to Omani Government. - Our business overhead includes our head office staff (largely Omani), legal, finance and other fees represent 5% of our cost base – again all spent in Oman with Omani citizens or companies. - Depreciation and insurance constitutes 21% of our cost base, insurances are all in place through local insurers and their brokers with our finances being arranged through Omani owned Banks - Food and accommodation which forms 11% of our cost base is spent entirely with local suppliers - Spares and consumables which constitute approximately 10% of our cost base are sourced in Oman from local suppliers
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
